For Halloween, we grew and donated Spinner Gourds and mini-pumpkin gourds to both pre-schools (Family Building Blocks and HeadStart) as well as decorated the entries of the church with corn stalks out of the Garden.

THE WEEDS

Our Number One nemesis this year! With Big Thanks out previously to Margaret and Cindy for their dedication to eradicating the weeds by hand pulling – no simple task as they seem to grow faster than we can pull them! – we've taken delivery of several rolls of weed control fabric which will be rolled out this Spring and knock down our Labor needs (and sore knees!).

SEASONS END

With the current growing season 98% complete, we are in the process of cleaning / clearing out the beds and rows and putting the garden to sleep for the Winter. We have planted Garlic and will be planting more as weather allows and will follow with cover crops of Clover, Fava Beans and Cow Peas to help provide green manure for our Spring crops.

A number of planned projects as noted below, will be commencing soon and will provide additional growing areas for both food and flowers as well as areas for walks and reflection (or just a nice place to have lunch?!).
